### Colletta to speak on 17 September



**John Colletta**

Nationally-known speaker and genealogist John Colletta will speak at St. Louis County Library Headquarters in the auditorium on Saturday, 17 September. Doors to the auditorium will open at 8:30 am (the library reading room will open at 9 am as usual). The program will begin at 9 am and feature four one-hour lectures. Seating is limited to 250.

Copy down the information, and then find the article using St. Louis County Library's microfilm copy of the newspaper.

## MICROFILM GEMS

### Grandpa's bar or tavern

If your ancestor owned or worked in a bar or tavern in St. Louis County between 1891 and 1910, a new microfilm in Special Collections Department may be of interest. "Dram Shop License Books," covering 1891–1903 (B–Z) and 1901–1910 (A–Z), appear as the **first item on film no. SL-MISC-1** (drawer 45) and may contain information of interest to you.

Each entry includes the person's name (but not the name of the dram shop), amount paid, township, and place of business. Records indicate that licenses expired every six months, meaning two entries per year for each bar. For example, in 1897 Henry Schnatzmeyer of St. Ferdinand Township, had a place of business in Spanish Lake, and A. J. Shores, Jr., had an establishment in Carondelet Township at 11 Mile House on Lemay Ferry Road. Entries are organized by first letter of the person's last name, then chronologically, so it is an easy source to check.
