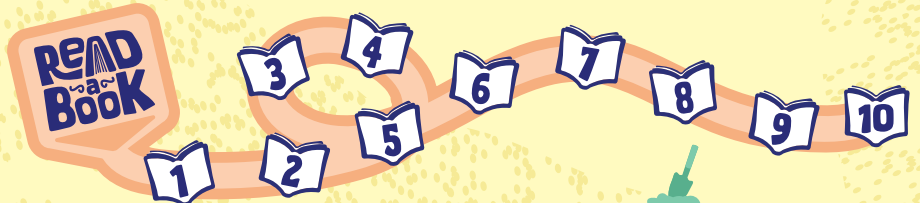


EARLY CHILDHOOD (AGES 0-5)

UNearth a Story

Dig through the shelves at the library until you find a book about dinosaurs.

Make fossil impressions by pressing rocks, shells or plants into playdough.

Practice dinosaur yoga. Can you stretch your wings like a Pterosaur and shake your tail like a Tyrannosaurus rex?

Make a mini museum: pick 5 objects and tell a grownup about the exhibit you created.

Flip over rocks and tell a story about what you find hiding underneath.

Read a book about animals that burrow underground.

Build a blanket cave and read inside it with a flashlight.

Join a library story time at the Saint Louis Science Center or Saint Louis Art Museum. Check library event pages for details.

Dig in and get dirty at the Nature Playscape in Forest Park.

Visit the Storybook Walk between the Forest Park Visitor Center and the Missouri History Museum.

AROUND THE WORLD

Check out a book in another language and learn a new word.

Make a flag using your favorite shapes and colors.

Use playdough or objects at home to make a model of the world.

Make an Antarctic-inspired sensory bag with ice cubes and water.

Read a story from another country.

Read a book about a country playing in the soccer World Cup. How is life different there?

Visit the Kenya's Kids exhibit at The Magic House to see how kids live in a different part of the world.

Check out a cookbook from the library and try a recipe from another country.

Make your own UFO by taping two paper plates together and decorating it.

Play freeze dance with music from another country.

Find an animal from each continent at the Saint Louis Zoo.

OUT OF THIS WORLD

Make moon sand with 2 cups flour and 1/4 cup oil. Explore the texture with cups, hands or cookie cutters.

Create constellations using marshmallows and toothpicks or pretzel sticks.

Read a book that's set in space.

Spray water into the air on a sunny day and try to make a rainbow.

Find the moon during night or day and see what shapes you can see in it.

Cloud gaze. What shapes can you see?

Find the Sweet Gum tree that has been to outer space at the Missouri Botanical Garden.

Practice zero-gravity building by building with blocks while hanging upside down from the couch.

IMAGINATION

Turn a cardboard box into an imaginary setting for your toys.

Draw a picture with the biggest piece of paper you can find. Tip: cut open a paper bag.

Read a book that's set in an imaginary world.

Make a puppet with an old sock or a paper bag.

Mix food coloring or paint to make new colors.

Zoo animals use their toes and mouths to paint pictures. Can you?

Visit the History Clubhouse at the Missouri History Museum and imagine what life was like for kids in the past.

Come to Groove in the Galleries at the Saint Louis Art Museum on July 17. Imagine the sounds of art, and turn it into a dance party!

Come up with an imaginary pet and draw a picture of them.

Visit the Children's Village at The Magic House and imagine a world run by kids.
