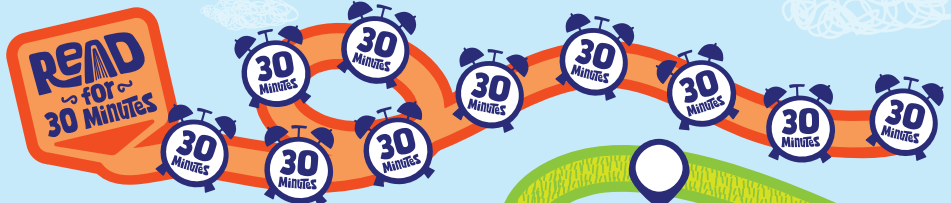


TEENS (AGES 13-17)

UNearth a story

Visit the "As the World Turns" geospatial exhibit in the Planetarium Lobby at the Saint Louis Science Center to learn about the history of mapping in St. Louis.

Play Around the World at Forest Park's basketball courts.

Take a stroll through the Arid House at Missouri Botanical Garden and explore the plants and the ecoregions they are native to.
